Forms and money can be placed in a separate envelope on collection plates.


Cost is \$11.00 for each memorial poinsettia.

Nine youth attended, and our staff would like to run it for another summer, possibly increasing to 2 weeks.

A successful fundraising golf tournament was held in July.

Renovations are taking place at the Youth Centre. The bench seating is being reupholstered, and a new kitchen is being completed. This will now meet Public Health codes, so that the Youth Centre will be available for groups to rent.

We have a very faithful volunteer who continues to keep up with repairs on the building, including the attached apartment.

Many children are attending the drop-in centre this Fall. We have some new volunteers who have begun working with them.

Thank you to those who continue to pray for the young people in our community, and assist in the cost of programming to meet their needs. We are very blessed to have such an enthusiastic staff at YfC – North Perth.
