From the Minister's Desk

1 Corinthians 13:12 - "For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known"

This verse written to the church in Corinth is one of my favorites and it is all about connection. The verse particularly is talking about being face to face with God. That for now, as we live, we only understand God in part, as if we are looking in a mirror and it is dark. When we pass on, we will be face to face with God and we will know God in a deeper way

For Paul, who is writing this, this has a double meaning. Paul never met Jesus directly outside of a vision. He has never really been face to face like the disciples have been. This verse is as much speaking about us and what we will go through but also himself and what he probably longs for. A real face to face with Christ.

Connection in the church is vital, one of the things I have always said is "if I don't have time for people what am I doing?" Ministry really is partly about connection with people and in our post covid world, that moment of face to face is even more meaningful.

Easter is a time of connection as well; a time for us to understand who God really is and who Christ is. To connect this sacrifice that we believe, to our lives in a meaningful way.

I set myself a challenge when I started at Knox about a year and a half ago. I said to myself, "In the first year I am going to call every person who is a member." That is about 500 people, and I certainly did call all the numbers, perhaps I cut your number if I had seen you at church, or we had already interacted in person. I talked to a lot of answering machines, but the biggest issue was, in the years between the last directory and my arriving at Knox, many numbers changed. Many times, I called a number, a lot of them being 291, to receive the, 'this number is no longer in service' message. That really stunk because I was denied connection.

Below you will find a way to help with that, there is a small form, which you can return to the office or simply give to your elder, and we are hoping that you might update your contact information with us. You don't need to do it right away and you don't need to give us more information than you want, but we really would like to connect with you. Please consider it.
