## **Christmas Pageant and Concert**



The Mitten Tree will be up during Advent, located in the entranceway into the Main Hall again this year. Your donated gifts of hats, mitts socks and scarves will be delivered to the Salvation Army and Evangel Hall in time for Christmas and the coming cold weather. Evangel Hall is also an ongoing appeal to our church. Financial donations may be made using the third portion of your envelope

Our Advent appeal this year is in support of the Salvation Army Food Bank. The congregation can donate using the third column of their offering envelope marking it "Salvation Army" or by bringing non-perishable food items to the church which we will forward to the food bank. There are boxes and baskets set up by the entrances. There are people in our community who need to use a food bank to help them provide food for their families. Let's show our support and help keep the shelves full this Christmas.

Finally, the third appeal is to invite you to contribute to the organization known as **It takes a Village.** We ask that you purchase personal hygiene items, paper products such as Kleenex, bathroom tissue, paper, towels, tooth paste and tooth brushes and deposit them in the boxes marked "It Takes a Village".

We have been doing fairly well financially during these difficult times, however we need your continued support. There are several ways you can donate. For people coming to services in the sanctuary, there are *offering plates* at every entrance to drop your envelope into.

We can now accept *Interac E-Transfers*. This is a great solution as the church does not have to pay a service charge fee on the deposits, as it does when you use your credit card. It is not set up to deposit automatically at this time, so use the security question "street" and the answer "Livingstone" until further notice. You can add your envelope number under the 'message' portion if you want.

We continue to use the system of *Electronic Giving* through our website. Simply go to <u>www.knoxlistowel.ca</u> and click on the button labelled "Give Through On-line Tithe" located on the homepage. Please note that there is a service charge fee on every transaction.

Finally, one of the easiest ways is to set up a *Pre Authorized Remittance* (P.A.R) and have a specified amount come off your bank account every month. Contact the office to set this up.
